HARLEM ROCKER checked slightly at the start, was taken in hand early, settled just off the pace for a half, swung out midway on the turn, advanced four wide into the stretch, charged to the front in midstretch then drew off under good handling. J BE K sprinted clear in hand, set the pace along the rail, extended his lead on the turn, relinquished command to the winner in midstretch and continued on well to best the others. DOUBLE OR NOTHING pressed the pace between horses for six furlongs and drifted out while tiring in upper stretch. FACE THE CAT raced just off the pace to the turn and lacked a late response.
